
Starting Year 7 at Blatchington Mill School

Student Services



Student Services is the office in the middle of the school, near the Drama Studio. Year 7 students were asked to pick the main reasons you would go to Student Services:

- If you lose something, always go to Student Services first.
- It's where you sign in/out if late to school or leaving early.
- If you need a new timetable, Student Services can print one.
- If you aren't sure which room you're supposed to be in,
 Student Services can point you in the right direction.
- If you need to contact home in an emergency, you can call from Student Services.

So there will be many times you visit them. Each Year 7 becomes a 'student helper' in Student Services, which is great for letting you see how things work and helps you learn more about where everything is.



- *Students Services' top tips for finding something you've lost:
- 1. Think where you last had it are you sure you brought it into school?
- 2. Go back to the room where you think you last saw it and have a good look.
- 3. Ask your friends whether they've picked it up by mistake.
- 4. Look through lost property. It may take a couple of days for missing things to be handed in.
- 5. At the end of each half-term, there is a lost property table after school for everything that is unclaimed.
